Withdrawal Symptoms

Selective Serotonin-Reuptake Inhibitors (SSRI)

Includes:

Fluoxetine (Prozac) Fluvoxamine (Luvox) Citalopram (Celexa)

Fluvoxamine (Luvox)
Paroxetine (Paxil)

Escitalopram (Lexapro)

Sertraline (Zoloft)

Duloxetine (Cymbalta)

Effexor (Venlafaxine) (SNRI)

Withdrawal Symptoms:

- Abrupt withdrawal from high doses may occasionally cause a syndrome consisting of-
- > **Somatic Symptoms**: dizziness, lethargy, nausea, headache, fever, sweating, malaise, incoordination, insomnia, vivid dreams;
- > **neurological symptoms**: paresthesias, dyskinesias, "electric-shock-like: sensations, visual discoordination;
- > **psychological symptoms**: anxiety, agitation, crying, irritability, confusion, slowed thinking, disorientation; rarely aggression, impulsivity, hypomania, mania.

Most likely to occur 24-48 hours after withdrawal (re-institute drug and taper more slowly)

Incidence related to half-life of antidepressant - reported most frequently with paroxetine, least with fluoxetine.
